COVID-19

Please be aware that when we are notified of a positive C-19 case within our community PHE and the DfE advise us to self-isolate potential contacts immediately as a precaution. It takes several hours, sometimes more, to forensically track and trace contacts. We are always hopeful that following the original notification that your child has to self-isolate, we will be able to ascertain that your child is 'not' a contact and therefore will no longer need to self-isolate. We will always inform you by phone if this is the case. We recognise how disruptive any self-isolation is to each family, the pupils learning and to the running of our school.

We are very aware that there is a heightened anxiety amongst families as everyone wants to protect time with loved ones over the Christmas Break. For the final two weeks of term we have reduced the

year group bubbles at playtimes. Staff are incredibly vigilant in logging pupil movements and interactions – all in line with the NHS Track and Trace criteria.

We cannot authorise any absences without a good reason and sadly wanting to quarantine before meeting with loved ones at Christmas cannot be authorised. The children learn better in school and it is unfair to expect teachers to plan remote learning on top of their face to face teaching commitments.

Attendance

Whilst we understand that there are some parents that wish their children to miss the last week of school - absence will be unauthorised and teachers – if teaching in school – will not be able to set remote learning.

Remote Learning at Christ the King School

Advent



The highlight of the Second Week of Advent, as we journey towards Christmas with Mary, is the FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION.

This feast makes us think of St. Bernadette Soubirous. The Virgin Mary appeared to her in one of the apparitions at Lourdes, and said, "I am the Immaculate Conception." And when she heard Mary say this, Bernadette ran to the local priest, to tell him.

What does that name mean? It means that God chose a mother for his Son, a unique woman, whom he wanted to be perfect. So God filled her with grace and holiness from the moment of her conception in her mother's womb. God also gave Mary a listening heart; She had to be attentive, aware, and patient, to hear God's voice in the midst of daily life.

This Advent is the time for faith. So like the Blessed Mother, and like St. Bernadette, we're called to be attentive, to listen and to act, trusting God's will in Faith, Hope and Love.

5. Advent Prayer Calendar

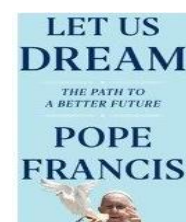
