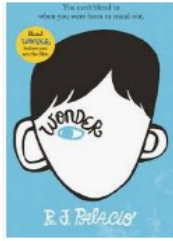
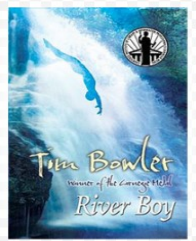


English:

- To infer, predict and explain ideas from text based upon poems to perform, rivers and newspaper reports.

Science: Forces

- To plan different types of scientific enquiries to answer questions, recognising and controlling variables, taking measurements, recording data and results and using tables, scatter graphs, bar and line graphs.
- To explain why unsupported objects fall towards the Earth (gravity) & identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces
- To recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.
