Year 1 Volcano science, floating and sinking and dissolving.




Year 2 stretchiest material investigation



## COVID 19 – Testing Families




Where should Parents get their kits? Guidance: <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/rapid-lateral-flow-testing-for-households-and-bubbles-of-school-pupils-and-staff>

In the first instance you should get their kit from your employer; if they offer testing to employees or

- at a local test site (7 tests in a pack and two packs per person. Poole Leisure Centre car park **(BH15 1TN)** between 1pm- 7pm with no booking needed. Second collection point Christchurch Two Rivers Meet LC **(BH23 1HW )** and the Furlong Centre Ringwood **(BH24 1AT).**)
- by collecting a home test kit from a test site-see above
- by ordering a home test kit online-which you can pick up or have delivered. Only 1 person should go and get test allowance to reduce travel as we are still in lockdown
- Following positive LFD test at home, a confirmatory PCR test should be booked online or by calling 119. Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the pupil or student and their close contacts should self-isolate-if negative pupil can return to school-if positive they must self-isolate for the time agreed with school
- Once a positive pupil has been tested and done self-isolation, they should be taken off the testing system

All lateral flow test outcomes must be reported to the NHS (guidance provided with LFD testing kits) and also to the school. If a person has a positive lateral flow test outcome, then they must immediately self-isolate and book a PCR test. We will provide more information on reporting to schools next week.
