- Children will follow the RWI scheme learning how to read different sounds, write letters and form sentences.
- Children will develop their early writing skills including sentence structure, capital letters and full stops.
- Children will continue to develop and use adjectives and conjunctions in their writing.
- Children will engage with our focus texts Dragon Post, Zog and Jack and The Beanstalk,
- Children will use story maps and actions to learn the features of letter writing and stories.

Physical Education:

Core skills and Net Wall games:

- Children will learn basic net wall games.
- Children will continue to develop their core functional skills including, hopping, skipping, balancing, moving in different directions and throwing.

Computing:

 Children will learn how to create their own animated story books by drawing and animating pictures.
