- Children will follow the RWI scheme learning how to read different sounds, write letters and form sentences
- Children will develop their early writing skills including sentence structure, capital letters and full stops
- Children will engage with our focus texts 'The Old Toy Room' and 'Christmas Presents'

Art/Design & Technology:

Drawing and sketching

- Children will draw and sketch Christmas scenes, looking carefully at the detail
- Children will design and make a time travelling vehicle using a range of materials

Physical Education:

Geography:

 Children will use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.
