Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year and welcome back to school. Over the past two weeks we have enjoyed getting to know some new pupils and staff and sharing stories of time spent with loved ones over the Christmas break. The pupils have returned to school with renewed vigour and enthusiasm and I am hugely impressed with their learning attitudes and behaviour. You should be very proud of your children!

Thank you to all parents for working with us to maintain our **Covid-19 Control Measures** and for testing your family with LFD testing kits at least twice a week. The small number of families who have done this have helped to prevent outbreaks in some classes due to early identification of asymptomatic cases. Please do not send you child to school if they have a cough, fever or loss of taste or smell. The new variant symptoms have tended to be headaches, upset stomachs and cold symptoms. If your child has any symptoms you should still book them a PCR test as soon as possible.

Following the news that I will be Executive Headteacher of Christ the King and St Mary's School in Poole from February half term I would like to reassure you that I will very much continue to lead our school and be a visible part of our community.
