## **Christ the King News**

Dear Parents and Carers,

The DfE requested that schools in areas with high positive Covid 19 cases implement enhanced control measures from 1<sup>st</sup> November until 12<sup>th</sup> November; this was to try to curtail the rising number of positive cases. Due to the continuing rise in cases this week within schools, BCP area have been directed to continue with enhanced measures for a further fortnight, starting Monday 15<sup>th</sup> November. This week we have seen a rise in the number of positive cases throughout the school, **therefore we need all parents and families to support us in protecting our school community from outbreaks or possible closure**. Please reinforce the importance for hand washing, social distancing and cleaning regimes with your children at home. If you could also routinely do family lateral flow testing this will help identify cases early. We still plan to go ahead with our Christmas events, however, if cases continue to rise, we will inform you of any changes from 29<sup>th</sup> November. Thank you for your support.

## Enhanced measures include:

- 1. No changing for PE on site.
- 2. Regular cleaning and hygiene measures practise routines of handwashing and wiping surfaces at home please).
- 3. Limit mixing of groups and halting gatherings beyond a single phase.
- 4. Seating plans for older pupils
- 5. Adults wear face coverings within communal areas of the school and outside at transition points.
- 6. Parents on site wear a face covering at all times
- 7. All families encouraged to do regular LFD tests Monday before school and again midway through the week.
- 8. Any child or adult who is symptomatic isolates immediately and books a PCR test.
- 9. Symptoms include: fever, loss of taste and smell, new continuous cough. Recent symptoms include: headaches and upset tummy.

Any attendance due to Covid -19 is recorded and would not trigger involvement with our school education social worker.

Please ensure you pick your child/ren up on time as teachers and staff have other commitments and meetings after school - they then miss these if they are looking after children. Children taken to the after school club due to late pick-ups will incur a child care cost.
