Uniform

Thank you to all pupils who have returned to school with correct uniform, sensible school shoes with laces or straps and smart hair styles. All hair accessories must be in school colours (red / navy) and small bows only. Long hair on boys and girls must be tied back, no braids and no shaved hair styles (grade 2 minimum please).

Safeguarding

Please ensure you communicate home collection routines to the class teachers so that they know the regular faces for picking up children. Any changes in pickup must be reported in advance of home time to either the office staff or class teacher. We do authorise Year 6 pupils to walk home alone with permission from parents. We expect parents to deliver / collect all younger aged children from their classrooms please.

Health and Safety

You will have noticed our new electronic gates on the drive. Please ensure that you and your child / ren follow the advice given below:

- Never walk up the vehicle access road
- Not to let children go through the gap in the fence immediately inside the pedestrian gate
- Not to walk in the road/drive at any time
- Encourage children to walk along the path to the zebra crossing and not to cross at either end of the black fence
- No children should be touching the vehicle gate at any time

Mobile Devices

Only pupils who walk to school alone should bring in a phone to school. These must be handed to the office staff on arrival at school and collected from there at 3.15pm.

Vacancies


There are currently two posts advertised to commence this term: Pastoral Support Worker and maternity cover for Mrs Riggs, Pre-school leader.
