Dogs

School sites are not for dogs.

"It shall be unlawful to bring a **dog** onto the **grounds** of any **school**, regardless of whether the **dog** is restrained by a leash, chain, rope, cord or similar device"

Dogs shall be **allowed on school grounds** as an exception to this section under the following circumstances:

- 1. Is a registered hearing or sight dog and we have received a letter warning us that this will be happening.
- 2. Part of an agreed risk assessment activity

Safeguarding

We expect parents and carers of our pupils to behave with manners and restraint when on or near the school site.

If there is a discussion between adults, hopefully it can be conducted in a civilised manner without an audience.

Any incidents of disagreements that disintegrate into foul language and threats of violence are distressing for children to witness and will not be tolerated.

We cannot enforce good conduct but disturbances of the peace are reportable to the police.

Parking

The new BCP have started an initiative whereby parking enforcement agents will be targeting schools throughout the borough in a concentrated effort.

Remember, it is illegal to park or stop on the zigzags.

Lyme disease

Lyme disease is a rising issue in the UK and it is important to be properly informed, particularly when there is a lot of misinformation and misconceptions out there about the illness. Lyme disease is predominantly caught from the bite of an infected tick. Whilst the UK countryside is some of the safest in the world, tick bites are probably the highest risk we face when outdoors, in terms of likelihood and impact. Ticks can be as small as a poppy seed and have a painless bite, so they are often missed.
