The Christmas Posadas tradition begins!

Las Posadas is a wonderful 400+ year old <u>Advent</u> celebration in many Latin countries. For 9 days, from December 16th-24th, the families prepare for Christmas by acting out and reliving the days Mary and Joseph experienced as they journeyed to Bethlehem, as written in the Gospels. Mary and Joseph travelled from place to place seeking rest, only to be continually rejected, causing the Baby Jesus to be born in a stable manger.

This Catholic <u>Christmas</u> tradition was brought to Mexico in the 16th century by Spanish Augustinian friars as they evangelized the New World. Today the Las Posadas continues to be a wonderful way share and celebrate our Christian faith and heritage. Christ the King Church are continuing this tradition with a statue of the 'Holy Family' spending time in different homes over the Advent season. Thank you to our church community for allowing the 'Posadas' to spend some time in school last week.
