COVID-19Guidance for the Summer from Public Health Dorset

An email has been sent out from Public Health Dorset with guidance for the summer holidays. Please read this very carefully and follow the advice. Thank you for supporting our COVID-19 control measures until the end of term.

Summer Home Learning

The basic requirement over the summer is that all pupils log on to and use IXL and read as often as possible. Teachers will send home year group specific summer home learning.

Covid-19 Control Measures – Update for Summer and Autumn 2021

This is especially important since we have several staff and pupils now self-isolating due to being close contacts of positive contacts outside of school.

We will continue to have staggered start and finish times next term as, following the removal of control measures nationally, Public Health envisage a rise in the numbers of Covid-19 cases. There will not be a requirement on schools this summer to track and trace but should you become a close contact of a person testing positive with Covid-19 you will still be required to self-isolate in the interests of public health.

Families are advised to use LFD tests in the two week run up to the return to school in September and not to return to school if you or a member of your household has symptoms of Covid-19.





Celebration of Learning
