Dear Parents and Carers,

We are especially grateful to the teachers who organised our Christ the King Jubilee celebrations on Thursday 26th May before the half term break. It is good to see that the children have returned refreshed and hope that pupils remain well and attendance this half term picks up for all year groups. The impact of the pandemic compounded by other illness and unauthorised holidays has had a significant impact on pupil attendance which has dropped below the national average of 95% for many schools nationally. Next week we move onto Year 4 times tables assessments – the first time Year 4 pupils have taken these new national assessments for Year 4.

Instrument lessons for September

There will be some places available in September for children who would like to begin learning the Flute, Keyboard or Guitar.

Lessons are open to all KS2 children, if spaces are available. Each child will have a shared 20-minute lesson. Lessons are £60 a term and fees are payable a term in advance. This guarantees children 10 lessons (Guitar lessons are £54 for 9 lessons a term). Lessons are held in school time, in consultation with the class teacher.

Please contact the instrument teacher directly if you would like more information, or to book a place.

Flute: Mrs Fisher will continue to give the Flute lessons. Each child will need their own Flute. Flutes can be hired from Soundstorm at an approximate cost of £96 a year (or £36 a term). <u>Guitar</u>: Mr Nuttall will continue to teach children the Guitar. Children will need their own nylon string Guitar and footrest. If you would like Guitar lessons, or more information, please contact Mr Nuttall. <u>peter.nuttall@hotmail.com</u>

<u>Keyboard</u>: Mr Marshall will continue to teach Keyboard. Children will need their own Keyboard at home to practise on, but can use a school Keyboard for their lessons. If you would like Keyboard lessons, or more information, please contact Mr Marshall. <u>kieranmarshallatstmarks@yahoo.com</u>
