All pupils should attend school on the first day in normal school uniform – the class teachers will let you know via email or Class Dojo / Tapestry which days they will need to attend school in PE uniform.

Uniform

Uniform matters and at Christ the King School we pride ourselves on high standards of presentation. All pupils should wear the correct school uniform including a jumper or cardigan with the school logo.

Hair styles should be suitable for school – NO SHAVED cuts please. Shoes should be black - slip on shoes for girls are NOT allowed as they inhibit safe playtime play.

PE uniform expectations are equally important and school logo PE T-shirt is advised. Navy shorts, sweatshirt top and jogging bottoms should all be plain navy with no logos. Leggings are not permitted. Please come to school in PE uniform on PE days.

COVID-19 Guidance for Autumn 2021 from Public Health Dorset

We continue to follow the DfE COVID-19 advice for schools and will maintain our hygiene and ventilation control measures. Masks are optional in communal areas and will no longer be worn by staff within classrooms. Masks are now optional for all adults on site, but may be requested for visitors meetings indoors. Children are no longer segregated within bubbles and clubs and trips will resume this term.

Families are advised to use **LFD tests** this weekend prior to the return to school on Monday 6th September - **Do not return to school if you or a member of your household has symptoms of Covid-19: A new continuous cough, a high temperature, loss of taste or smell.**

For some children this will mean that they start the term with confidence.
