

Christmas Newsletter - Friday 18th December 2020

Dear Parents,

As we come to the close of this term I would like to thank you once again for all your support over the past few months.

As we reflect on the year 2020 there are so many mixed emotions and memories to recall. This year, more than any other, our call to 'serve' our community in 'faith, Hope and Love' has never been more meaningful. I pay tribute to the courage and kindness of all the staff from our admin staff, teaching and learning staff and our site staff and cleaners, who have all maintained a positive outlook to use our gifts to serve and make our school a haven of safety, hope and love. Despite all the additional Covid-19 control measures staff have been mindful of the need to motivate your children to learn and make up progress for the lost time during lockdown.

Pope Francis, in his recent book, Let Us Dream, states: 'Our greatest power is not in the respect that others have for us, but the service we can offer others.'

I am very proud of our school and of the children and I know that this will continue to be the case in 2021. Pupil wellbeing and their learning will continue to be top of our agenda next term along with the safety of the community. So many of our families have benefited from the foodbank and from the Government voucher and computer schemes and we hope to be able to loan computers to the most needy families again next term when required.

COVID-19 cases over the holiday

Public Health England are directing schools to continue the contact tracing process for any positive cases of COVID-19 where pupils or staff may have been infectious before the end of term. This means the school will be 'on call' up to and including 24th December.

As part of our service to our community we will do what is necessary to keep our community safe. If your child receives a positive test result for COVID-19 before 24th December, please email us at our dedicated email address: covid@ctkcps.com

This email address will be checked daily at 10am and 11am from Saturday 19th December until Thursday 24th December. You will be contacted by a member of the leadership team

and we will go through the contact tracing process. We will then email the families of all pupil or staff who we have identified as close proximity contacts advising them that their child will need to self-isolate for up to 10 days. We are acutely aware how disappointing and upsetting it will be for any family or individual to be asked to self-isolate during the festive period, but the greater need to protect others comes first.

We will also monitor the COVID email inbox from 2nd January prior to return to school so that we are aware of any families or staff who have become symptomatic and tested positive for Covid-19 during the second week of the break, therefore needing to self-isolate into early January.

During the holiday is continues to be important that we all follow the guidelines to keep our wider community safe. Your child should return to school as planned on Monday 4th January unless they or anyone in your household is unwell. They will need to stay home if:

- Anyone in the household develops symptoms of COVID-19; additionally, anyone with symptoms should be tested.
- Anyone in the household is tested for COVID-19; as soon as someone in the household books a test, all members must self-isolate in line with the stay at home guidance (https://tinyurl.com/sdoyyrw)

From Monday 14th December, self-isolation has been reduced from 14 days to 10 days for contacts of confirmed cases. Please see the below link for further information.

For the first week back in January pupils will remain in **class bubbles** whilst we reassess the national and local picture. We hope to return to year group bubbles from 11th January 2021.

Hygiene Routines

Please remind your children over the break to maintain good hand and respiratory hygiene. Sneezing or coughing into their elbow should become a habit and will help us on our return to school to keep everyone bug free. They should continue to wash their hands regularly for 20 seconds, cover faces with a face covering is old enough and maintain 1M-2M distance between other persons when in public spaces.

DFE announcements regarding Primary tests

Here is a link to the full statement from the Department for Education:

"For primary assessments, key stage 1 tests in English reading and mathematics, and the English grammar, punctuation and spelling tests at key stage 1 and 2 will be removed for one year, in recognition of the challenges posed by the pandemic ... teacher assessment in

English reading, writing and mathematics at key stage 1, and all other assessments at key stage 2, will remain" More detailed information will be communicated to the parents of the children affected by these announcements in due course.

Uniform

We will be tightening up our routines regarding uniform from January. All children should adhere fully to the policy. School shoes must be worn with full uniform – trainers may only be worn with PE uniform. Pain navy track suit bottoms are to be worn on PE days – not patterned or logo leggings, etc. Parents must inform the school if their child is sent into school in incorrect uniform and the reasons why. We will help families with donations of uniform where we can.

Long hair should always be tied back whilst in school – Hair – no shaved hair styles please. A full uniform list can be found on our website.

Parking

Please be mindful that cars must never park on the yellow zigzags – the yellow zigzags are a measure to protect our children. Disabled badge holders may park on double yellow lines.

The church have requested that the church carpark is NOT used by parents of pupils at Christ the King School – we should respect this request please. We have liaised with the church to set up a permit system where those most in need for health reasons may use the carpark. Being late or avoiding walking a distance is not a suitable reason.
