

School Sports Funding 2021/2022

Number of pupils on roll: 340

Total Sports Grant allocation: £18,950 + £3,221 (c/f) = £22,171

In April 2013, the Government announced a new initiative for Physical Education (PE) and Sport. The School Sport Premium is a fund allocated to every Primary School as a legacy of the London Olympic games. This was designed in order to promote a healthy lifestyle and improve the quality of PE and Sport within Primary schools.

Primary schools are given autonomy on the allocations of the funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. These areas include; increasing participation in PE and Sport, developing the quality of teaching within the subject, creating an inclusive whole school ethos in encouraging all pupils to live a healthy lifestyles and to reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Impact statement:

Resources

Purchased sports kits for children to use at sporting fixtures (football kit/ athletics kit). As a result, children were able to participate in competitive fixtures against other local primary schools to gain experience. Children represented the school with pride and were fantastic ambassadors for the school.

Purchase of a shed for storage of equipment. As a result, all equipment used for PE/ sport across the school is kept in organised containers to allow for easy access. This has helped teachers/ support staff to locate equipment quickly and have the resources relevant for subject specific lessons.

Purchase of a range of resources to promote high quality PE lessons. As a result, during PE lessons, children have had access to adequate and appropriate equipment to develop specific skills in a range of sports/ activities. This has increased pupil skill acquisition and also boosted enjoyment when taking part (at all ability levels). For example, the purchase of quality tennis equipment has ensured planned content is learnt and performed well in PE lessons. This has had an impact on pupil confidence to participate not just in school but also in extracurricular activity.

Staff CPD

Throughout the year, staff have had an opportunity to work alongside experience skilled PE specialists who have delivered a range of sports. This has included:

- Planet Education (delivery of the PE curriculum)
- Chance to Shine cricket (cricket)
- AFCB UKS2 (football games/ promoting healthy active lifestyles)

As a result, staff have gained more experience and confidence in the delivery of a range of sports. They have been able to observe skilled specialists deliver these lessons and how to incorporate progression across a series of lessons.

We have continued to deliver the LTPE scheme of work to support the planning, delivery and assessment of P.E. This is an embedded scheme of work across the school and as a result, members of staff are confident in planning and delivering their own PE lessons.

Activities for children

Annually at Christ the King, we pay for Youth Sports Trust membership which provides us with Physical Education resources and CPD opportunities. In addition to this, we enter into the BSSA sports events which take place throughout the academic year. This allows our sports teams to participate a number of Level 2 and 3 Sainsbury's School sports competitions including: football, cross-country, netball, tag rugby, tri-golf, tennis, basketball, cricket, swimming, rounders and athletics.

Not only do we provide many opportunities to participate in Level 2 (Inter-school) and Level 3 (County) events but we also provide our children with chances to compete at Level 1 (Intra-school) competitions. These include our annual sports day and extra-curricular clubs. We have provided a range of free extra-curricular clubs throughout the year which has seen an increase in pupil participation. Following frequent free sports clubs attendance, the children have participated in level 2 sports fixtures where they have competed against local primary schools. We have ensured that these fixtures are not exclusive to the more able children but have provided opportunities for less competent children (B and C teams). This has been a huge success (in the autumn and spring terms) with an increased number of children participating in sports events.

Throughout the year, 8+ extra-curricular sports club were offered to our children (including 2x free sports lunchtime clubs). As a result, children (including the least active) were enable to participate in regular sports clubs in addition to their PE lessons. This has significantly impacted on their lifestyles and confidence levels. Through our membership to BSSA, we were able to send various Year 6 children to attend Primary School Bronze Ambassador Training. This enables the children to train to be a young sports leader and give them an understanding of how they could have an impact in our school. There are now **20 trained sports leaders** at our school and form our 'Sports Committee'. These sports leaders have officiated our Level 1 sporting events. Last Autumn term, we targeted non-swimmers in UKS2 to take part in regular weekly swimming lessons. As a result, a large number of non-swimmers were able to swim 25m and were able to gain significant knowledge to perform basic swimming strokes.

In the future we intend to use the funding:

• Membership of the **Bournemouth Schools Sports Association** (BSSA)

- **Provide cover for teachers** to receive professional development in PE and to supervise sporting events.
- CPD in the delivery of games within the National Curriculum.
- Subsidize transport, pool hire and swimming instruction for pupils in KS2.
- To continue to **engage the least active pupils** in extracurricular clubs at lunchtimes and afterschool.
- Provide specialist coaches / teachers for games to support the curriculum delivery by class teachers.
- Provide a comprehensive extra-curricular sports program for vulnerable children (SEND/PP).
- Opportunities for vulnerable groups to participate in sports fixtures.
