Design a cake to celebrate our school jubilee. Think about our school colours and values, you could even have a go at baking it!








Outdoor art: Texture treasure hunt

Design and create your own bunting to celebrate our School Jubilee. Decorate it with things that remind you of school.






Outdoor art: Spirals and Snails


