Dear Parents,

Hurray, we have successfully arrived at half term, and with the exception of Year 2, we have remained open to pupils. Thank you to all families who have been prudent and informed us immediately if a member of their household has been symptomatic of COVID-19 and sort tests quickly. Thankfully most tests have been negative and pupils and staff have seen short term disruption and absence. Nevertheless, each absence impacts on pupil progress and we need on-going parental support with remote home learning. Absence and changes in routine can be challenging for some pupils and can damage pupil engagement in their learning. We are continuing with our wellbeing focus in school with daily journaling and trick box. Please continue reviewing the day with your child each evening; discussing what they have enjoyed, what they are proud of and what they are grateful for. This simple exercise keeps us focusing on the positive and protects our wellbeing.

Remote Learning at Christ the King School

Year 2 to Year 6: Please contact the school if you have difficultly accessing Google Classroom or IXL. Teachers have demonstrated how to log on and use these platforms during lesson time. Well done to pupils in Year 6 this half term who have been our home learning champions – nearly all pupils completing home work on time.

COVID-19 Risk Assessment

Ventilation is a key part of our control measures and this will not change as the weather gets cooler. We will ensure that every room has a flow of air as this helps mitigate the risk of spreading viruses indoors. Pupils will continue to wear school uniform to school, but we advise that as the weather gets cooler they wear an under vest or bring in an additional fleece layer to wear over their uniform. They will also need a winter coat to wear outside.

If your child or a member of your household becomes symptomatic of COVID-19 over the half term break, please follow the Government guidelines and apply for a test. Please inform the school that you are symptomatic via email to Karen.mandale@ctkcps.com and let us know who is symptomatic, when they first showed symptoms, date of test, outcome of test and please leave a contact number. Thank you.

Keep Our School Open

Please be prudent and limit social mixing over half term. When the children come back together on Monday 2^{nd} November, after the break, we hope that our bubbles will continue to hold strong in restricting the spread of the virus. The winter months will be the hardest and loneliest for anyone needing to self-isolate, therefore, restricting our social interactions over the break will reduce the likelihood of the virus spreading. and our school closing.

Thank you to those parents who have made the effort to park further away from school freeing up space for local residents. We appreciate how stressful it can be for parents trying to park and pick up their children on time.


Parents Evenings

Feast Day: 22nd October - Happy feast day to all pupils and staff who are members of our Blue House group — St John Paul II House. St John Paul II was born Karol Wojtyla in May 1920 in Poland. He became Pope (head of the Roman Catholic Church) in 1978 and died in 2005. Pope John Paul II visited England in summer 1982. I remember travelling to both Manchester and Cardiff to see this gentle pontiff. At the youth mass in Ninian Park, Cardiff, the voices of the young echoed around the stadium as we sang:
