History:

Children will learn about the actions of significant individuals—explorers of the past and present.

Children will learn about how actions of others has affected their lives today.

Art

Applying drawing skills to an illustration

Learning simple printing techniques

Religious Education:

This term the children will learn about Judaism and will take part in a whole school zoom workshop led by Rabbi Zvi. The will learn about shabbat and what symbolises this for people of the Jewish faith.

Pentecost

The children will learn of Jesus' Resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Some of our key questions will include:-

What responsibilities are involved in passing on messages?

Which is the best way to pass on messages?

Science:

Habitats — Children will continue to investigate which animals live in local habitats and micro-habitats around the school grounds and in the local area. They will begin to consider why different animals and plants are suited to their chosen habitats.

Living things — Children will explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive.

Food Chains — Children will begin to describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.

PE

Children will focus on increasing their range of basic gymnastic skills by creating short sequenced movements and developing coordination and gross motor skills

Computing:

To evaluate and test games.

Maths:

Calculations

*Children will learn addition and subtraction of all one digit numbers

*Children will add and subtract ones to any number up to at least 100

*Children will calculate 10 more or 10 less than any number up to at least 100

*Children will carry out two digit addition and subtraction and some will begin to learn how to 'carry' or 'exchange' when needed

*Some children will begin to learn about setting out addition and subtraction in columns

*Children will learn facts for x10, x2 and x5 tables

*Children will learn the opposite division facts for these tables facts

*Some children will learn to count in 3s

Mental Maths Calculations:

*Find one half, one quarter or one third of a given number

*Learn addition pairs equal to 20

*Develop understanding of fact families linked to calculations.
