Times of the day

PE

PE lessons for **3K** are Wednesdays and Thursdays, with Fit Friday on Fridays. For **3R**, PE days are Thursdays and Fridays, which includes Fit Friday. Correct PE uniform is navy jogging bottoms or shorts, and a white polo shirt, with a plain navy sweatshirt.

Home Learning

We recognise that your children may be tired at the end of the day as they get used to regular routines again. With that in mind, for the first week, the only home learning that will be expected is to:

- **Read/BugClub for 10 minutes daily** (and to sign the children's reading journals each day)
- **10 minutes of Times Tables Rockstars**

We do hope, that as the weather begins to improve, there will be opportunity for the children to be outside, and that you will encourage them to rest and play after school.

As part of learning about wellbeing and feelings, we would like the children to please bring in a tissue or cereal box, as we'll be making Worry Friends. Please bring them in on Wednesday 10th March and Thursday 11th March.
